## **Executive Summary**

#### Overview

This report provides a summary of the performance for the provision of title assessments and processing within Department of Regional NSW's Exploration, Mining and Geoscience (MEG) for Quarter 1 2020 (1 January 2020 to 31 March 2020).

MEG's performance is reported against the Service Delivery Standards, which note target timeframes for the processing of applications under the Mining Act 1992. These are published by MEG at:

## Processing timeframes

Processing timeframes for title applications and renewals commence when a complete application, including all supporting information, is received. If an application is deficient, the applicant is notified and given 10 business days to submit all required supporting information. Processing timeframes end when the applicant is notified of the proposed decision for the application.

Processing timeframes for security deposit releases commence when a determination is made on the release of a security deposit and end when the refund request is sent to the Department's finance team.

Exception management (stop-the-clock) protocols apply when circumstances beyond the control of MEG's process prevent the valid assessment of an application. More information on exception management can be found at:

#### **Quarter 1 2020**

#### Performance overview




Figure 1 Q1 2020 service delivery standard performance

This following chart (Figure 1) details performance of proposed decisions and security deposit releases, as measured against the Service Delivery Standards published by MEG for Quarter 1 2020 (Q1). During this quarter, 88 notifications of proposed decisions and security deposit releases were issued. Of these, **94 per cent** met the target timeframe.



#### Breakdown of submission timeframes

The following chart (Figure 2) details the timeframe in which matters were submitted for the proposed decision/security releases in Q1 2020.

Of the total 88 proposed decisions/security releases in Q1 2020, 77 were submitted in or after 2019. The remaining 11 proposed decisions were submitted prior to 2019.

Figure 2 Breakdown of applications/security determinations submitted prior to and in or after 2019




### Performance by submission timeframe

The following charts (Figures 3 and 4) categorise performance by timeframe (i.e. whether the application was submitted in or after 2019, or prior).

Of the 88 proposed decisions/security releases/approvals in Q1 2020:


- 77 were submitted in or after 2019, with **95 per cent** meeting the target timeframe.
- 11 were submitted prior to 2019, with **91 per cent** meeting the target timeframe.

## Applications received

For Q1 2020, there were 99 applications received, compared to 65 for the same period last year (Table 2).

On average, there were approximately 102 applications received per quarter during the period 1 January 2019 to 31 March 2020.
