

3. Supporting information

Why do I need to serve a notification to the landholder?

If you intend to apply for a mineral claim, you must first serve notice using Form WC21 to all landholders of the land on which your proposed mineral claim is located. This is an obligation under section 177 of the *Mining Act 1992*.

Why does my notice need to include a map of the land?

The map is required to meet your obligations under clause 41(2) of the Mining Regulation 2016.

The notice must include a map that identifies the location of your proposed mineral claim on their property. The map must be at least at 1:100,000 scale, clearly indicate the extent and location of that land relative to property boundaries and include man-made features such as roads, fences and buildings.

When do I need to serve the notice on the landholder(s)?

You must serve the section 177 notice using Form WC21 on the landholder(s) before lodging a mineral claim application.

Keep a completed copy of this form and map to attach to your application for a mineral claim using Form WC2A Application for a mineral claim within the White Cliffs Mineral Claims District.
