EXEMPTION (SURVEY PLANS REFERENCING MINES OR PETROLEUM SITES TO GEOCENTRIC DATUM OF AUSTRALIA 1994 GDA94)

Survey plans to Geocentric Datum of Australia 1994 (GDA94) exemption

What does the exemption apply to?

This exemption applies to the requirement for survey plans prepared in accordance with clause 122 of the Work Health and Safety (Mines and Petroleum Sites) Regulation 2014 to reference a mine or petroleum site to the Geocentric Datum of Australia 1994 (GDA94).

An operator of a mine or petroleum site is exempt from the requirement for the survey plan to reference the mine or petroleum site to the Geocentric Datum of Australia 1994 GDA94.

The exemption takes effect on 28 February 2020.

What should be done?

A survey plan required to be prepared pursuant to clause 122 of the Work Health and Safety (Mines and Petroleum Sites) Regulation 2014, must reference the mine or petroleum site to the Geocentric Datum of Australia as referred to in clause 5B of the Surveying and Spatial Information Regulation 2017.
