PRACTISING CERTIFICATES – CHECK ON PROGRESS

As the implementation period is complete, holders and mine operators should be checking their progress with having current practising certificates (PCs) and satisfying the conditions to continue being nominated to exercise the functions:

Check functions

- Does individual have all the functions they exercise on their PC?
- Refer Guide: Statutory functions, Fact sheet: Practising certificates
- Quarry Managers should check tier level of their sites refer Fact sheet

Check conditions

- Are all conditions being satisfied, including maintenance of competence?
- Have holders notified Regulator of change of contact details?
- Quarry managers Tier-2 should have minimum qualifications by 1/10/24

Renewal

- Are any holders due soon to renew their certificate?
- Are holders ready for an audit, including at renewal?
- Are succession plans in place providing for replacement of holders?

Invitations to undertake a voluntary audit, so holders can check their progress, are made periodically through the <u>Mine Safety News</u>. Compliance audits will follow as communicated through our <u>compliance priorities</u>.
