

CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCE

Underground mine supervisor: oral examination sample question and marking criteria

Background

As an aid to supporting candidates to better prepare and perform in examinations, the NSW Resources Regulator and the examination panel have provided a sample question and marking criteria for the underground mine supervisor certificate of competence oral examination.

Sample question

You are the underground mine supervisor at the mine. A worker informs you that the ventilation in their work area is not to standard. What do you do?

Marking criteria

Background reference – extract of WHS statutory function description

During the shift: Consult with workers and supervisors in relation to any changing conditions/requirements, risk management, resourcing etc. (page 2)

Note to examiners: Up to seven minutes may be allowed for an answer, which may include, but will not be limited to, the responses below:

- check primary ventilation function
- inspect work area
- measure ventilation, how (prompt)? Use of anemometer (i.e. Kestral), gas detector etc

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- direct that all work in the area ceases
- withdraw workers from the area of risk
- barricade area and communicate the issue to other workers
- if the fault can be identified and managed e.g. poor/substandard ducting installation, plan to rectify, rectify area, area entered only to rectify
- the fault is not readily identified/managed
- report to the superintendent/manager
- report to ventilation officer

One mark for each response above or, for other suitable response/s as deemed by the examiner. Pass mark to be assessed as competent for this question - 7/10.

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
